

Our “Celebrating 50 Years” exhibit begins on Thursday, May 2 with its opening reception on Saturday, May 4 from 3-6 pm. We are featuring 10 remarkable artists who have been actively exhibiting at Glass Growers for over 20 years.

One of our featured artists is photographer and digital artist Greg Zbach, who began exhibiting at Glass Growers in 2003. Around this time, many photographers focused on black and white works for the gallery setting. Greg’s color photography broke away from the norm and proved that there was a strong interest in color photos. He is one of GGG’s top-selling artists with 552 works sold over the last 21 years and has been featured in many solo, duo, invitational, and group shows.

Greg Zbach reflects on his experience with GGG: “GGG has been my second home for over 20 years, a safe space for me and my art. I have life-long friends and some of my fondest memories at GGG. They have always been open to new ideas and honest when I needed to hear it.”

In the 1970’s Greg took part in proposing, designing, and building Gannon University’s WERG radio station and then hosted a Friday evening music show.
